Frequently Asked Questions

When and where is the event?

Sunday, September 11, 2016
1 to 5 p.m.
Civic Center Park in Denver

Do I need to buy tickets/register?

No, the event is free and open to the public. There are no tickets required for entry.

Can I bring lawn chairs?

Yes, please bring lawn chairs and/or blankets. Lawn seating will be available on a first-come, first-served basis; arriving early is greatly encouraged, as are blankets or low-rise concert/beach chairs.

Can I bring kids?

Yes, families are welcome. In addition to the ceremony and concert, there will be an array of public safety demonstrations and interactive activities for families to explore, including fire trucks, robots and more. (Located in Lincoln Park, in front of the Capitol building)

Will there be food/drink?

Concessions and a beer garden are available on-site. Attendees are welcome to bring their own picnics. Denver park rules will be in effect during the event, including no glass containers. Also - due to the crowd size - no BBQ grills are allowed.

Where should I park?

Metered parking will be free, and there are numerous surface lots downtown, but we encourage public transportation due to the size of the crowd expected and road closures. Civic Center is easily accessible by light rail, bus, bicycle or the 16th Street FREE MallRide. Bike racks will be available.

Please note that road closures will include:

Broadway from W. 14th Ave to W. Colfax
Bannock from W. 13th Ave to W. Colfax
W. 14th Ave from Cherokee to Broadway

ADA Drop Off and Seating

ADA Drop Off: ADA passengers can be dropped off at the corner of 14th & Bannock. To access this location please proceed to 14th and Cherokee cross section with your vehicle. Denver Police will allow you to pass through the barricades and proceed to the 14th & Bannock intersection. Once your passenger is dropped off, please make your way out of the barricades.

ADA Seating: Guests in need of accessible seats will have prioritized seating located southwest of the stage. Please follow signs or ask anyone wearing a yellow Volunteer shirt.
